Glennfield Group Use Reservation

PARK NOTES

Effective January 2nd, 2009, Fish Creek Provincial Park will be accepting reservations for the operational period April 1st to October 31st, weekends and holidays of each year for Areas A and B in the Glennfield day-use area. Booking arrangements will be available through the Fish Creek Provincial Park office with an associated fee. These reservation procedures have been suggested by group users over the past number of years.

The available facilities at each site include:

- Access to fully serviced washroom
- Large modern picnic shelter with group fire ring and stove (firewood must be brought in by the group - it is unlawful to collect and burn deadfall)
- Power outlet
- Potable Water
- Parking
- Picnic tables



Through this booking and fee structure, this reserves the site for your groups' exclusive day-use during normal posted hours of operation.

Why a reservation system?

Glennfield is one of the most popular day-use areas in Calgary, and recent facility upgrades have afforded the opportunity to accommodate the growing demand. This arrangement will effectively organize and manage use, as well as maintain a quality visitor experience. These group use procedures are in-line with similar City of Calgary facilities and those available throughout the Provincial Parks system.

What is the reservation process?

Areas A and B are available for reservations. Area C will remain available for (first come, unreservable) public use (refer to map on the back page). To reserve Areas A and/or B contact the Park office by telephone at (403) 297-5293 or in-person at the Bow Valley Ranch Visitor Centre located at 15979 Bow Bottom Trail S.E., Calgary, Alberta.

What is the fee for reserving an area?

The rental fee is \$75.00 plus the required \$10.00 reservation fee. Monies are made payable **BY CHEQUE ONLY** to the *Minister of Finance*. Payment can be mailed or dropped off at the Fish Creek Provincial Park Administration office, Box 2780, 15979 Bow Bottom Trail S.E., Calgary, Alberta T2P 0Y8. Group Use permits are issued from this office.

After reserving the area, how do I open the gate to access the area?

After required payment and registration has been completed, a lock combination will be issued to the contact person and users can open the gate and access the site during the posted hours of operation. We require that you keep the gate closed at all times and discreetly provide the combination to your group to prevent other users from entry.

What should I do if someone is already at the area?

The reservable areas are some distance from the public parking area, so there is little chance of encountering another group. There may be users who have walked or biked to your area, but prominently displayed signage indicates the area is by reservation only and Park Conservation Officers have the authority to evict other users.

Glennfield is a treasured outdoor facility area that provides the community with a natural space for large group use. The Park hopes you enjoy your visit.

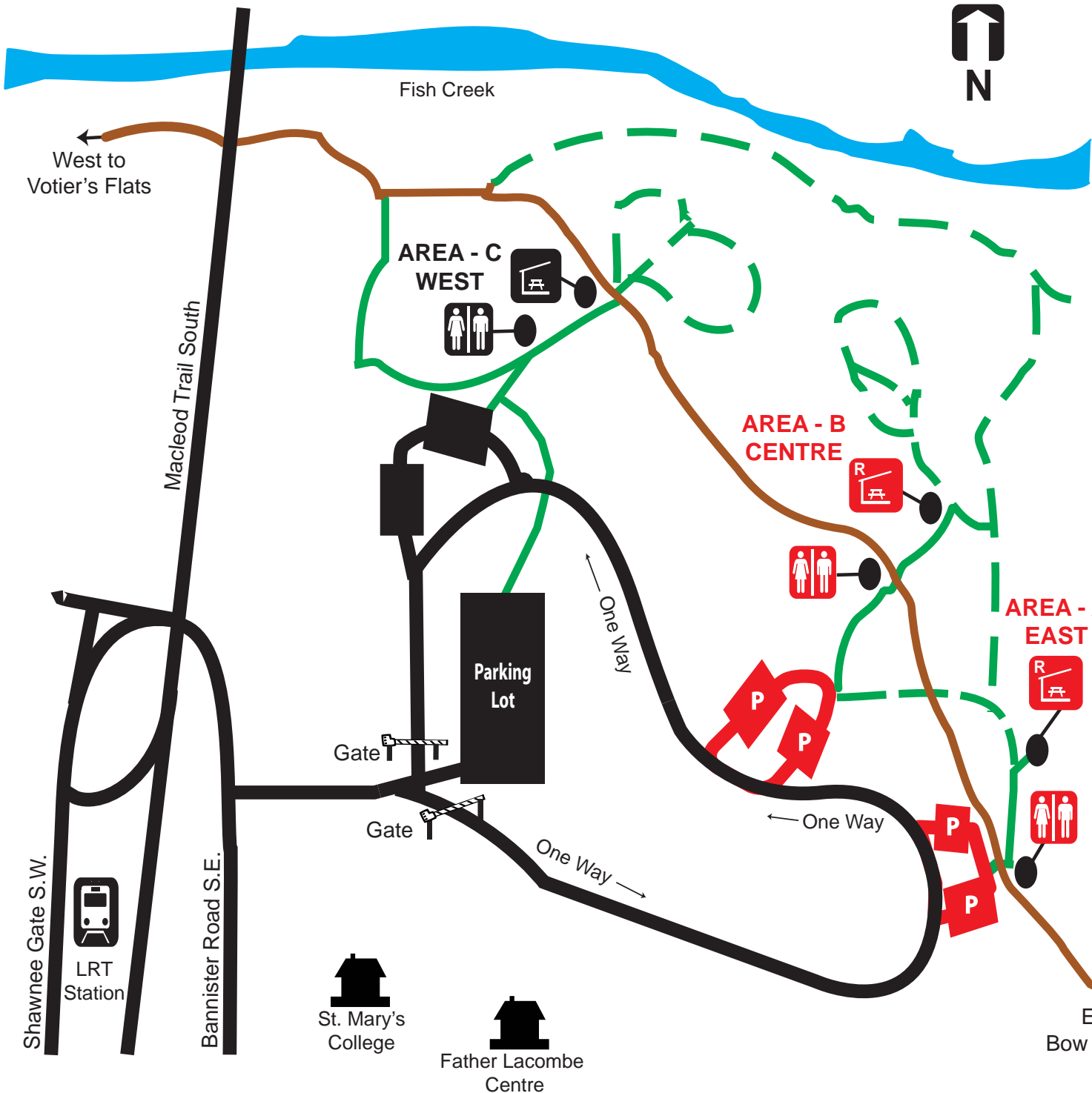
